### **Make Moorhead Home Property Tax Rebate**

The Make Moorhead Home Property Tax Rebate is a property tax break for the first two years after a new home is constructed. The rebate saves a new home buyer thousands of dollars. On a new \$300,000 home, the total value of the rebate may be as much as \$7,500. After the rebate period, the homeowner pays the same tax rate as other homeowners. The owner doesn't need to be a first-time home buyer; any newly constructed home in Moorhead qualifies the first two years after construction is completed.

No application is needed—when a building permit for a new home is issued, the

property is automatically enrolled in the rebate program. The rebate of the eligible portion of the tax payments will be refunded in December of each year of eligibility. This program is available through Dec. 31, 2024.

## Skateboarding features to be installed at 3 locations

Several Moorhead parks will receive new skateable features this summer, thanks to a community effort to revive skateboarding in Moorhead. A local group of active and former skateboarders has been working with Special Projects FM to transport, refurbish and coordinate placement of donated skatepark components from Watertown, SD. Watertown is building a new replacement concrete park and graciously donated the old skateboard features to Moorhead.

Working with the community, the Moorhead Parks Department has identified three locations to implement the skateparks: Hjemkomst Landing, 202 1 Ave N; Queens Park, 3201 20 St; and two underutilized basketball courts at Romkey Park, 800 19 St S.

Moorhead Parks and Recreation has also partnered with local organization Sleep Talk Skate to offer Skateboarding Camps in two sessions – June 3-11 and July 15-23 – for youth K-12. Registrants will team up with experienced skateboarders to learn kick turns, balance and board control, ollies and dropping in before working on other new tricks and skills.

### Minnesota property tax refunds benefit both homeowners and renters

### **Homeowner's Homestead Credit Refund:**

To qualify, you must have owned and lived in your home on January 2, 2023. The refund amount is based on household income (less than \$128,280 for 2022), tax filing status, and property taxes paid on principal residence. The maximum refund is \$3,140.

### Special Homeowner's Homestead Credit Refund:

This refund is based on the increase of your property tax over the previous year regardless of household income. You must have owned and lived in your home on both January 2, 2022, and January 2, 2023, and your property taxes on your home must have increased by more than 12% and at least \$100 from 2022 to 2023, not due to improvements you made to the property. The maximum refund is \$1,000.

### **Renter's Property Tax Refund:**

Renters may also qualify for a Renter's Property Tax Refund. You will need your 2022 Certificate of Rent Paid. The maximum refund is \$2,440.

### **FILING INSTRUCTIONS:**

Visit **revenue.state.mn.us** for filing information. You will need information from your 2023 Clay County property tax statement (mailed in March/April 2023) and your 2022 federal income tax return to fill out Form M1PR.

### **TIMING:**

The filing deadline is August 15. You have one year from the due date to file and claim a prior year refund.

## "Onward Moorhead: A Plan in Action!"



The City of Moorhead's Comprehensive Plan is a roadmap that helps the City implement the community's vision over the next 10 years. Community members, businesses and others worked with the City to create the Plan. Here are recent or upcoming projects and initiatives that advance the Onward Moorhead plan:

**New dock at M.B. Johnson Park:** The Greater Minnesota Regional Parks and Trails Commission announced the City of Moorhead received a Legacy grant of \$17,000 to purchase an accessible boat dock allowing residents to boat on and explore the Red River. This grant opportunity was made possible by the designation of M.B. Johnson as a regionally significant park in 2016. The new dock will provide a space to tie boats, improve ease of boarding boats, and provide more opportunities for recreation on the Red River – which is a designated state water trail.

**Natural Lawn Options:** Natural lawns are planned, intentional and maintained plantings such as grasses (not including turf grass), wildflowers, ferns, and shrubs. Input received from the community during the Onward Moorhead Comprehensive Plan process and resident surveys showed strong support for natural lawn options from the community. A recent City Code amendment provides property owners the option to incorporate natural plantings on private property without a permit.

Citizens Government Academy: The City of Moorhead held its first Citizens Government Academy in March/April 2023. Twenty-six Moorhead residents spent seven weeks learning about the inner workings of municipal government, including operations and policymaking. City leaders shared factors that shape the work of their respective departments, some detail about operational and strategic decision-making, and even what possibly lies on the horizon for the City. Graduates were honored at the April 24 City Council meeting. Watch next January for an opportunity to sign up for the 2024 Citizens Government Academy.

# **GET READY! Cleanup Days coming in early May**

Furniture, household goods, and appliances will be collected at single-family residence curbs during Cleanup Days on your scheduled garbage day in early May beginning at 5 am at no additional cost.

Cleanup Day will be your garbage day,

### **OPPOSITE** your recycling week.

- » If you are on A Week Recycling (red), your Cleanup Day will be on your garbage day the week of May 1-5.
- » If you are on B Week Recycling (blue), your Cleanup Day will be on your garbage day the week of May 8-12.
- **EXCEPTION:** Oakport neighborhood will be May 16, same as recycling day.

Apartments are not eligible for curbside pickup.

All residents may bring excess garbage to the Resource Recovery Center at the times noted below, free of charge with proof of residency.

## Cleanup Days require a huge amount of effort, coordination, and cooperation.

### Please follow these guidelines:

- » Tires will NOT be collected at the curb. Homeowners will need to dispose of them at retail tire stores or the Resource Recovery Center for a fee: \$4 for passenger tires; \$13.75 for truck tires.
- » Sort appliances, furniture, household garbage, metal, etc. into piles; different trucks collect specific categories of items.
- » Use disposable containers such as cardboard boxes (no loose garbage please).
- » Do not set items out more than one day earlier than your Cleanup Day.
- » During Cleanup Days, crews will not return to pick up garbage set out after your garbage day.
- » Two appliances per household will be picked up free of charge. Remove refrigerator and freezer doors for children's safety.
- » Do not place food or waste inside appliances.
- » No commercial waste will be accepted.
- » Keep garbage totes at least 4 feet away from Cleanup Days items.
- » Empty propane tanks will also be collected (valves do not need to be removed).

If you would like to get a jump on spring cleanup, bring furniture, household goods, and excess garbage to the Resource Recovery Center (3322 15 Ave N) from April 24-May 12 from 8 am-4 pm, free of charge. (This also applies to apartments.) Fees will apply for demolition/construction materials; proof of Moorhead residency (i.e. driver's license) required.

### Crews will not collect the following items curbside:

#### **Demolition/construction materials:**

Materials include lumber, vanities, cabinets, concrete, sheet rock, fencing material, windows, doors, and asphalt shingles.

#### Take items to:

- » Clay Demolition Debris Landfill, 6 miles west of Hawley and ¼ mile north of Highway 10; 701.642.3207
- » Resource Recovery Center, Monday-Friday, 8 am-4 pm, first and third Saturday of each month, 8-11:30 am; 3322 15 Ave N, Moorhead; 218.299.5016. Enter the 15 Ave N entrance.

Loads need to be hand-unloaded and fees will apply.

#### **Residential electronics:**

computers, computer monitors, computer peripherals, televisions, fluorescent bulbs, LEDs, cell phones, rechargeable batteries.

### **Household chemicals:**

paint, stain, varnish, automotive fluids.

### PUBLIC WORKS UPDATES

### **Emerald Ash Borer**

In February 2023, City of Moorhead Forestry staff discovered emerald ash borer (EAB) larvae during annual winter tree pruning activities. This finding was confirmed by the U. S. Department of Agriculture in March.

Emerald ash borer is an invasive woodboring insect that kills ash trees; if susceptible ash trees are left untreated, 90 percent will die within 8-10 years.



Moorhead has approximately 26,500 trees; 26 percent are ash. Forestry has developed a long-term management plan to deal with EAB. The goal is to preserve as many public ash trees as possible. Most healthy ash trees on public property with a trunk diameter of 11 inches or greater will be treated to kill the beetles and larvae and protect the tree. All ash trees on public property with a trunk diameter of 10 inches or less will be removed.

Residents with private ash trees need to decide if they plan to retain their trees. There are treatment options that are very effective. If trees are not treated, removal and replacement with a non-ash tree species is recommended as soon as possible.

### **Curbside yard waste collection**

Effective Sept. 1, 2023, Moorhead residents must use compostable/paper bags or reusable cans for curbside yard waste collection; yard waste in plastic bags will no longer be collected after that date.

The primary reasons for the change include alleviating the litter and costs of disposing clear plastic bags, minimizing maintenance and down time of the yard waste processing equipment, and eliminating contamination of the finished compost. The ultimate goal is to make the City's composting service more efficient and sustainable.



### Acceptable options for yard waste include:

- Reusable cans with lids (up to 32 gallons in size)
- Paper lawn bags
- Compostable lawn bags that are BPI-Certified and ASTM D6400 standard compliant (with the BPI stamp on the bag)
- Dropping off lawn waste at the City compost site, or dumpsters at Woodlawn Point (418 Elm St), the Public Works Shop (700 15 Ave N), the Resource Recovery Center (3322 15 Ave N), or Southside Regional Park (corner of Parkview Drive and 23 St S).

BPI-Certified compostable or paper lawn bags can be purchased at Moorhead's Ace Hardware, Menards, or online at various retailers.

## No Glass in the Blue!

City of Moorhead residents may no longer put glass into blue recycling bins.

Why not? According to Minnkota Recycling – which processes the City of Moorhead's recycling – glass is expensive to recycle, can create safety issues in the recycling process and contaminates the recycling stream.

### There are two options for residents:

- 1. Take glass to glass-only dumpster locations (Woodlawn Point, 418 Elm St; Public Works Shop, 700 15 Ave N; or the Resource Recovery Center, 3322 15 Ave N). The glass will be repurposed.
- 2. Put glass in with regular trash.

# Sewer issues: The City of Moorhead provides a 24-hour on-call service

Sewer issues are something that no homeowner ever wants to have. Heavy rainfall, loose debris, tree roots, and pipe deterioration or damage can cause sewer systems to not function properly. The City of Moorhead provides a 24-hour, on-call service to provide guidance to homeowners with sewer problems.

### If you experience slow drains or sewer back-up, there are some important steps to take:

- Contact the City at 218.299.5386 (prior to calling a plumber).
- City staff will inspect the sewer main and determine if the blockage is in the main line or your private service. The sewer from a building to the sewer main is owned and maintained by the property owner. The City is responsible for the sewer main, which is generally located in the middle of the street.
- If the problem is in the City sewer main, City staff will correct the problem at no cost to you.
  - » The City cannot reimburse you for contractor expenses incurred before contacting the City. Also, if a plumber has made repairs before the City evaluates whether the problem may be a City responsibility, the City cannot pay the plumbing costs.
  - » If a problem in the City sewer main resulted in damage to your property, contact the Wastewater Division for direction in filing a claim with the City's insurance provider. An adjuster will review the claim to determine liability.

Sewer odors can occur when basement floor or other drain traps dry up and allow sewer gas to enter buildings. Other times, a blocked roof vent may prevent sewer gas from releasing outside. In order to prevent sewer odor:


- Periodically check seldom-used drains and refill with water.
- Add a tablespoon or two of vegetable oil or mineral oil to slow evaporation.
- Keep roof vents free from obstructions, such as leaves, snow and ice.
- If sewer odor persists, call the City at 218.299.5386.

### Make sure sump pumps are disconnected from sanitary sewer system

It's spring, and that means it's time for Moorhead residents to disconnect sump pump hoses from the sanitary sewer system. Drainage should be directed to the street, backyard or side yard (please be courteous to your neighbors when choosing where to discharge). Sump pump discharges to the sanitary sewer during this time period overload the sanitary sewer system, which leads to basement back-ups for both you and your neighbors.

Residents may request a seasonal waiver to allow sump discharge into the sanitary sewer from November 1-March 31. Because the risk of significant rain events is lower during this time, the sanitary sewer system is capable of handling this extra water. That changes during the spring and summer months
