Garbage and Recycling Pick-up

- Place garbage (collected weekly) and recycling (collected every other week) containers curbside on your day before 5 am, free of obstacles (2' radius including other containers).
 - Find your day and the Holiday Garbage Schedule at cityofmoorhead.com/Sanitation.
- Excess garbage must be placed in a City of Moorhead pre-paid yellow bag, available for purchase at local grocery and retail stores. Garbage not in yellow bags incurs a special service charge.
- Large non-building-material items can be placed at the curb and arranged for pickup or brought to the Resource Recover Center (incurs a special service charge).

Curbside Branch Pick-up

May-Sept. – Collected on your recycling day **Oct.-April** – Call-in collection available

- Stack branches on your boulevard. Do not place in cans, boxes or other containers.
- Piles must be no longer than 12 feet long, 8 feet wide and 4 feet high.
- Individual pieces must not exceed 8 inches in diameter.

Curbside Yard Waste Pick-up

Mid-April - Mid-Nov. (weather dependent)

Drop-off collection available (limited basis) after curbside service ends.

- Yard waste (small twigs no larger than a pencil, leaves, grass, and organic materials from gardens) is collected at the curb on your scheduled garbage day.
- Yard waste can be placed in 32-gallon cans weighing less than 30 pounds, compostable bags, paper bags or clear plastic bags. There is no limit on number of bags or containers.

Clean Up Days

Clean Up Days is an annual opportunity for our community to dispose of extra trash and materials curbside. Each resident's Clean Up Day will be on their garbage day opposite their recycling week. Policies about what can and cannot be placed curbside are available at **cityofmoorhead.com/ CleanupDays.** The cost of this service is included in your monthly utility fee.

Please keep non-recyclable items out of the recycling bin. **When in doubt, throw it out.**

- Please do not attempt to recycle "tanglers" (hoses, wires, lights, etc.) or plastic bags.

GOOD NEIGHBORS

Smile and know your neighbors: The No. 1 way to be a good neighbor is to be friendly.



Start a Neighborhood Block Club: It promotes a sense of community and helps everyone watch out for the neighborhood together. Contact the Community Policing Coordinator at **218.299.5143** for help getting started.



Celebrate considerately and watch the noise: Realize that not everyone is on your schedule. Generally speaking, in residential areas, use special consideration with noise between 10 pm and 6 am.



Be responsible with pets: Pets are wonderful companions, but keep good habits in mind like leashing, minimizing barking and howling, and picking up waste.



Get to know Neighborhood Services: If you are concerned with parking, trash, junk vehicles, long grass, weeds, standing water, snow/ice removal or other general neighborhood problems, contact Neighborhood Services at 218.299.5434 or email neighborhood.services@moorheadmn.gov.



Plan or attend a Night to Unite event: Night to Unite, hosted by the Police Department on the first Tuesday in August, is an opportunity for Moorhead residents to gather as neighbors to affirm their commitment to a safe, healthy community. Call **218.299.5143** for more information.
