SUBJECT:

Public Hearing to Consider Actions Related to 2nd Ave N Area Underground Utility & Street Improvements (Eng. No. 23-A2-04A and 14-02-03F)

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to conduct a Public Hearing to consider proposed improvements for 2nd Ave N Area Underground Utility & Street Improvements (Eng. No. 23-A2-04A and 14-02-03F) and, following the Hearing, to consider a resolution to order the improvements and declare intent to assess.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The project area originally proposed and directed for study included the streets of 2nd Ave N from 8th St N to 12th St N, 12th St N from 1st Ave N to 2nd Ave N, and 2nd Ave S from 10th St S to 11th St S (map attached). These streets are included in the City's 2023-2027 Capital Improvement Plan and were scheduled for construction of improvements in 2023. In addition to the proposed street improvements, the project includes the relocation of City sanitary sewer and water mains required in order to complete the proposed 11th Street Underpass (Eng. No. 14-02-03F). The full cost of the utility relocation will be reimbursed by the State of Minnesota because it is a result of the 11th St underpass construction. The City previously executed a task order with WSB to design the relocation of the City utilities. This helps to coordinate the two projects because WSB is also the design engineer working for MnDOT to design the 11th St Underpass project.

As design continued on the 11th Street Underpass project (where MnDOT is the lead agency), it was proposed to separate this proposed street improvement project into two projects to better coordinate with the proposed underpass project. Second Ave N and 12th St N will be let as a City contract (Eng. No. 23-A2-04A) and constructed in 2023, while 2nd Ave S (Eng. No. 23-A2-04B) will be evaluated and completed later in connection with the 11th St Underpass contract, and is therefore not included in tonight's public hearing. Watermain construction on 10th St N from 1st Ave N to 2nd Ave N was added to this project to maintain watermain capacity around the underpass project. A separate report for 2nd Ave S will be completed prior to construction currently projected to be completed in 2024.

On December 12, 2022, the City Council ordered the preparation of the Engineer's Report, which was completed by City staff under the direction of the City Engineer. The report evaluated the existing street conditions of 2nd Ave N, 12th St N and 10th St N, along with the impact of the 11th Street Underpass on existing sanitary sewer, watermain and storm utilities and options for permanently rerouting these utilities to facilitate the underpass project. The report makes recommendations for the following street and utility improvements that will be constructed in advance of the 11th Street Underpass Project:

Install 15" Sanitary sewer on 2nd Ave N from 9th St N to 12th St N Install 15" sanitary sewer on 12th St N from 1st Ave N to 2nd Ave N

Install 8" Watermain on 2nd Ave N from 9th St N to 10th St N Install 10" Watermain on 2nd Ave N from 10th St N to 12th St N Install 10" Watermain on 10th St N from 1st Ave N to 2nd Ave N Install storm sewer on 2nd Ave N from 8th St N to 12th St N Rehabilitation of 2nd Ave N from 8th St to 9th St Reconstruct 2nd Ave N from 9th St to 12th St Reconstruct 12th St N from 1st Ave N to 2nd Ave N Patch 10th St N only as needed to complete the watermain improvements

A street rehabilitation involves the full pavement depth being removed and replaced, typically including the gravel base, but preserves most of the existing curb and gutter. A reconstruct includes the full replacement of the pavement and curb & gutter.

Other recommended improvements include replacing existing pedestrian ramps in order to comply with current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards and a small section of new sidewalk on the south side of 2nd Ave S between 9th St N and 10th St N that is proposed to fill a gap in accordance with the City Code. The report finds that the proposed improvements are necessary, cost-effective and feasible. The report further finds that the project is of a sufficient size to achieve a desirable economy of scale and may be constructed as a stand-alone project or in connection with some other improvement. A portion of the project cost will be financed using special assessments applied on an adjusted front foot basis at the standard rates in accordance with the current fee schedule (\$125.00 for reconstruction, \$75.00 per foot for rehabilitation projects).

On April 18, 2023, a virtual a public information presentation on the proposed improvements was made available on the City website. The public information presentation was intended to solicit resident/owner feedback prior to receiving bids. A letter was mailed to the abutting property owners notifying them of the presentation, and how to contact staff to ask questions or submit comments regarding the proposed design. At the time this report was prepared, staff had not received calls in response to the presentation.

Since special assessments will be used to finance a portion of the project cost, and the project has been initiated by Council action rather than by petition of the benefiting property owners, it is necessary to hold a Public Hearing prior to ordering the improvements. In accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 429, 10 days published notice and 10 days mailed notice of tonight's Hearing was provided to the 25 parcels that will be assessed for the proposed improvements. An example of the mailed notice is attached to this communication. At the time this communication was prepared, staff had not received any comments on the proposed improvements in response to the mailed notice. Staff will provide an update on comments received through Monday, April 24 at the Public Hearing. Staff recommends that at the close of the Public Hearing the Council order the improvements and declare the intent to assess. Since the project was initiated by Council action rather than petition of at least 35% of the benefiting property owners, the improvements may only be ordered by a 4/5 supermajority of the full Council (7 affirmative votes).

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

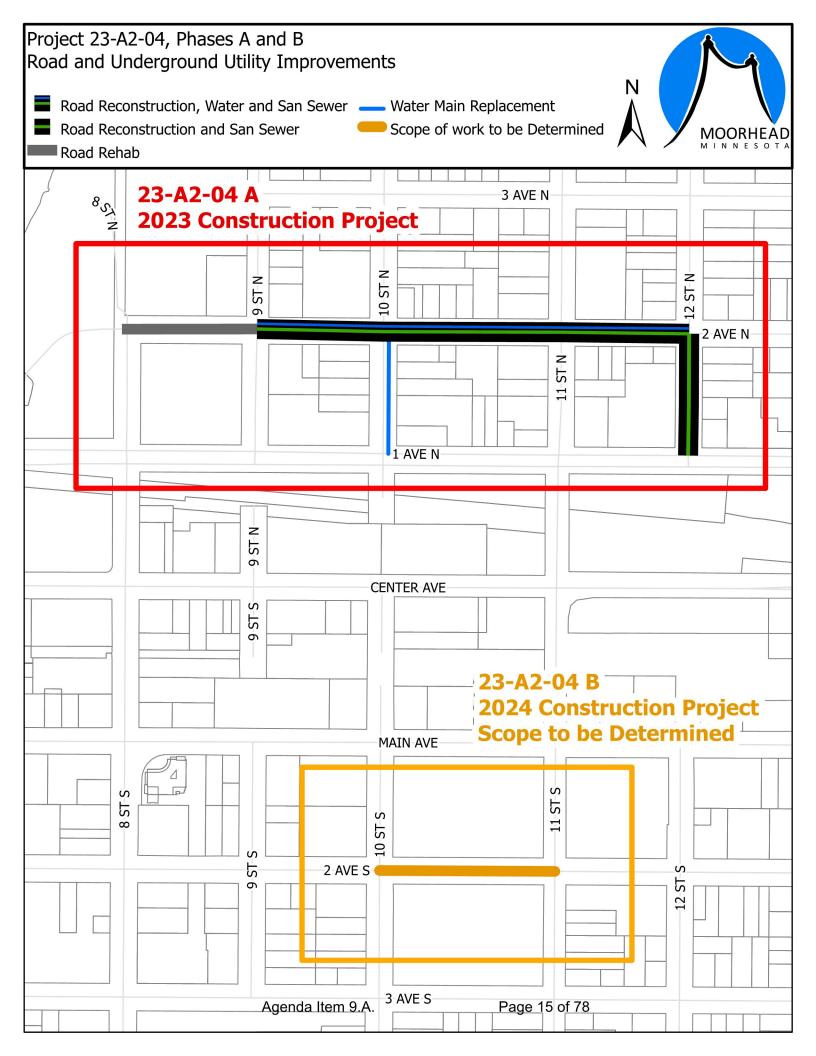
The current estimated total project cost is \$3,090,000. An estimated \$231,800 of the costs are proposed to be assessed. A portion of the cost associated with the MnDOT 11th Street Grade Separation Project, estimated to be \$1,950,000 will be reimbursed by MnDOT. The remaining portion, estimated to be \$908,200, will be the City cost.

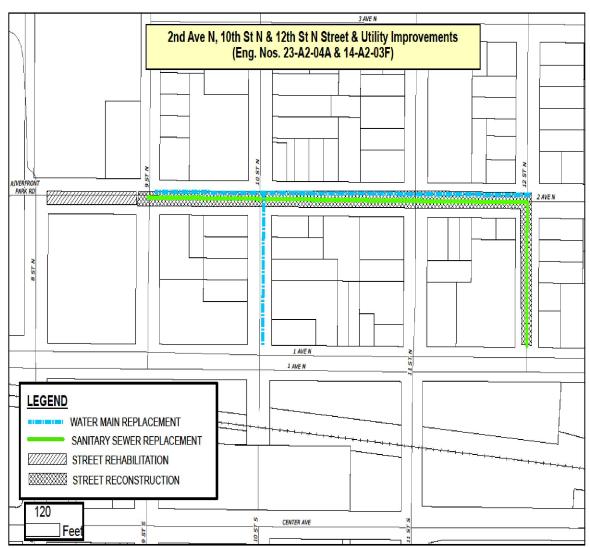

Local streets are the street network within a subdivision that is intended to provide access to the directly abutting properties and primarily serves local traffic. Typically, about 1/3 of the cost for local streets is assessed to the directly abutting lots within the subdivision. The city pays the rest of the cost through the general property tax levy.

ASSESSMENT INFO/CALCULATIONS: City assessment policy establishes a flat rate for street repair projects to keep things equitable among all properties in Moorhead. This policy has been in place since 2005. To account for variability in construction costs from year to year, and for the amount of front footage an assessment is based on (side lot footage is not assessed), the City established flat assessment rates per front foot for the various types of projects. Rates are set by the Council in its fee schedule,

and is intended, on average, to generate between 30% and 40% of the total project cost. The remaining cost is paid by the City through general tax levy proceeds. The policy provides certainty to residents that their assessment won't go higher, regardless of the final project cost. If the project cost goes up, the City pays the additional cost, if it goes down, City share is reduced.

Current rates are as follows:

Rehabilitation is \$75/Front Foot Reconstruction is \$125/Front Foot

ASSESSMENT EXAMPLES: A property abutting 2nd Ave N between 9th and 12th St or 12th St between 1st and 2nd Ave N with 75' of frontage, would be assessed a total of \$9,375. (75' x \$125). A property abutting 2nd Ave N between 8th and 9th St with 75' of frontage, would be assessed a total of \$5,625. (75' x \$75).

**Alternate assessment calculation methods are used to determine front footage for irregular shaped, cul-de-sacs and lots on curves, and first 150 feet of side lot footage is exempted from corner lots to keep special assessments equitable.

ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE: Final assessment notices are sent out in Sept/Oct and are then certified to the County on November 15. If you choose to do so, after final assessment has been adopted by council, you will have an opportunity to pay off, or buy down, the assessment, without interest, before it's certified to County and added to your 2024 property taxes.

This project will be spread over 20 years at an estimated interest rate of 5.5%. Actual interest rate will be determined after the City has bonded for the project. Below are two examples of projected amortization of the assessment, if paid over the 20-year duration. Note: Assessments can be paid off and paid down at any time without penalty.

Resolution to Approve Budget Adjustment #23-020 and Execution of License Agreement for Asset Management Software

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider a resolution to approve a budget adjustment and authorize execution of a license agreement with Novotx LLC for the acquisition of a new asset management software (Elements XS).

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The Engineering Department, Public Works Department, and Moorhead Public Service currently manage infrastructure, facilities, and other assets independently using a variety of systems; some of which are decades old and no longer supported. There is limited to no consistency between assets and limited to no capacity to share data between systems. Staff is proposing to implement a single asset management solution that includes centralized and consistent data management across and between assets and departments. The asset management system will include GIS-integration and provide the ability to manage multiple asset attributes including, but not limited to, asset inventory, location (via GIS), field inspection data, condition assessment data, preventive/corrective maintenance history, expected life, asset criticality, etc. The system will provide tools to facilitate risk-based analyses to inform planning for infrastructure renewal and repair costs. The system will also provide the ability to track and manage infrastructure service requests and customer-reported concerns and will be accessible by staff working in the field. Utilizing a uniform platform across asset categories will provide numerous opportunities to improve coordination, fiscal management, long range planning, and service to the public.

Elements XS, a state-of-the-art asset management software, has been selected through an exhaustive Request for Proposals (RFP) process. The staff review committee, consisting of members from Engineering, Public Works, IT, and MPS, evaluated 11 vendor proposals against a set of criteria such as the ability to track asset data, generate reports, and provide real-time access to asset information.

Elements XS has been identified as the preferred application and will provide numerous benefits to infrastructure management efforts by providing a structured environment to implement preventive maintenance plans, equate costs to asset conditions, and develop long-term maintenance and asset renewal plans. Elements XS was found to be user-friendly and easy to customize, providing a seamless experience for City employees. The vendor also offers comprehensive support and training services, ensuring staff are well-equipped to use the software effectively. Elements XS will replace several current systems that operate in departmental siloes.

The City Attorney has reviewed and approved the proposed license agreement for execution.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

On October 24, 2022, the City Council authorized an allocation of \$150,000 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for asset management software. The cost for the negotiated scope of work with Novotx LLC, including an allowance for implementation for all city assets including those managed by MPS and technical assistance to get the system up and running is \$250,000. Staff requests budget adjustment #23-020 be approved to allocate an additional \$100,000 of federal American Rescue Plan Act funds to enable this effort.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The proposed project is for the reconstruction of 11th St S from 2nd Ave S to 6th Ave S. This project was included in the City's 2023-2027 Capital Improvement Plan for construction in 2023. The project includes widening an existing sidewalk to make it a shared-use path for bikes and pedestrians. In order to minimize impacts of the shared-use path to existing trees, several easements were proposed. Five property owners have agreed to provide the easements, which would reduce the tree impacts from 12 trees down to 6 trees. The table below includes the property owners who have accepted the City's acquisition offer:

The City Engineering Department, through a licensed appraiser, is providing all easement acquisition services for the project. The cost for the easements is based on an appraisal, improvements acquired (e.g. trees), and damages (if appropriate).

Bids for the project were received on April 12, 2023, and are summarized in the Financial Considerations section of this communication. Staff recommends awarding the bid to the apparent lowest responsible bidder. Below is an outline of the proposed project schedule.

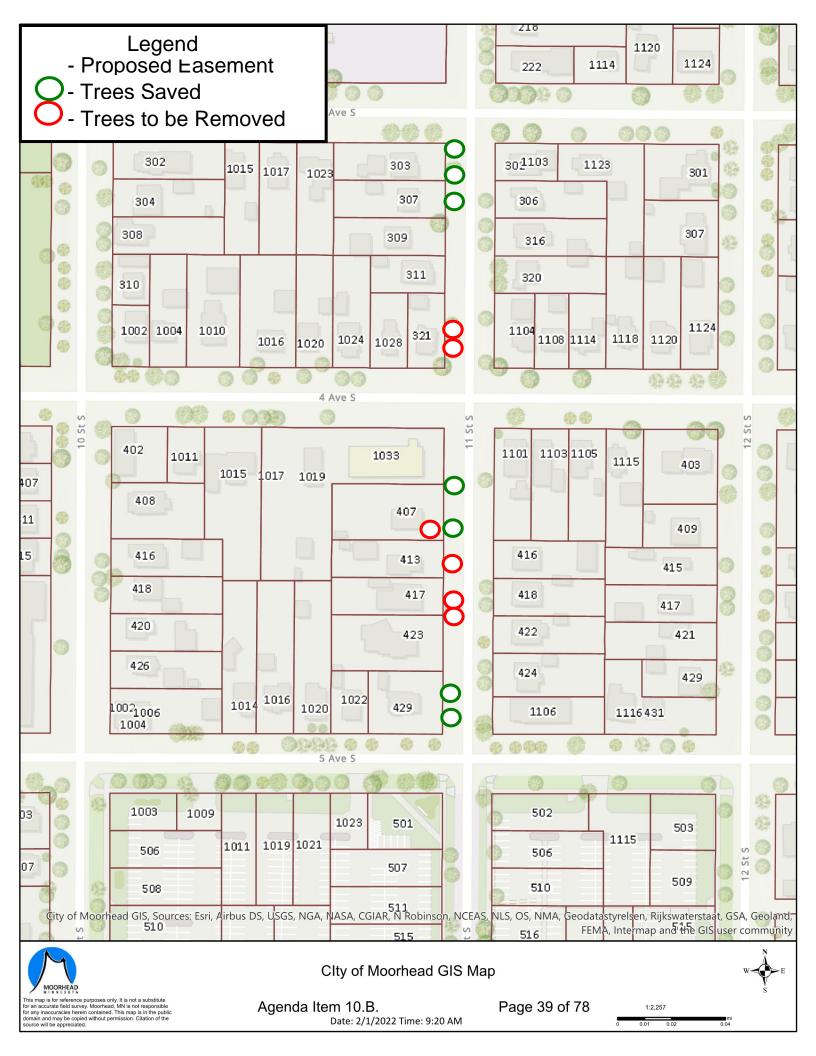
Based on the low bid, the total cost of the improvements, including contingencies and fees is estimated to be approximately \$2,401,000. The project will be financed through the PIR fund. Moorhead Public Service (MPS) will reimburse the City approximately \$392,000 for the associated watermain costs, and the City will use approximately \$122,000 in Municipal State Aid Maintenance funds. The remainder of the project cost (\$1,887,000) will be financed through the issuance of a General Obligation (G.O.) Bond. Of that amount, \$377,000 will be special assessed to the benefiting properties in accordance with the City's Special Assessment Policy while the remaining balance will be paid as a City share with debt service on the City share paid through the general property tax levy.

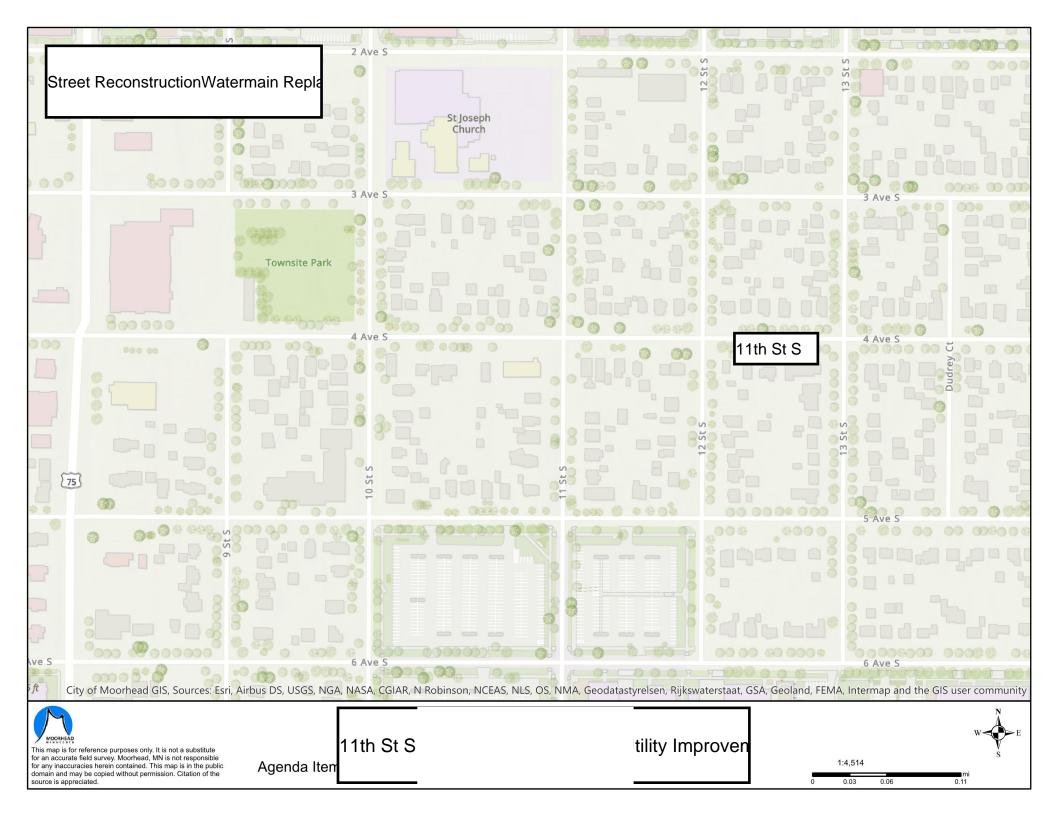

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider a resolution declaring costs to be assessed and ordering the preparation of proposed assessments, and a second resolution scheduling the Assessment Hearing for Monday, May 22, 2023 for completed public improvement projects funded with special assessments.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

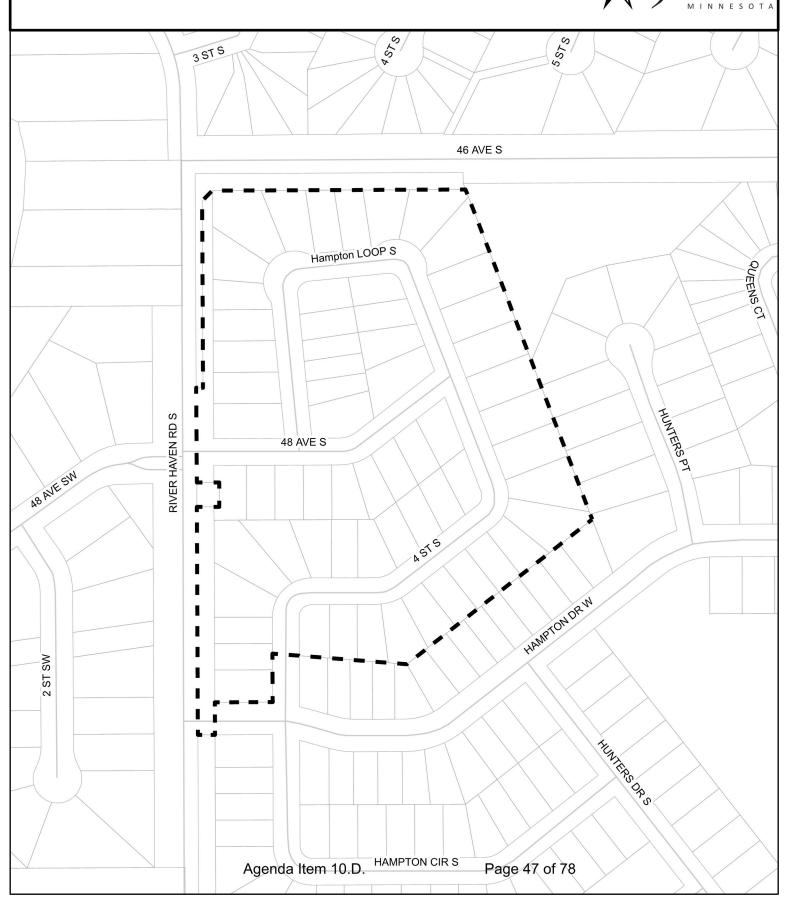

Assessed Parcels

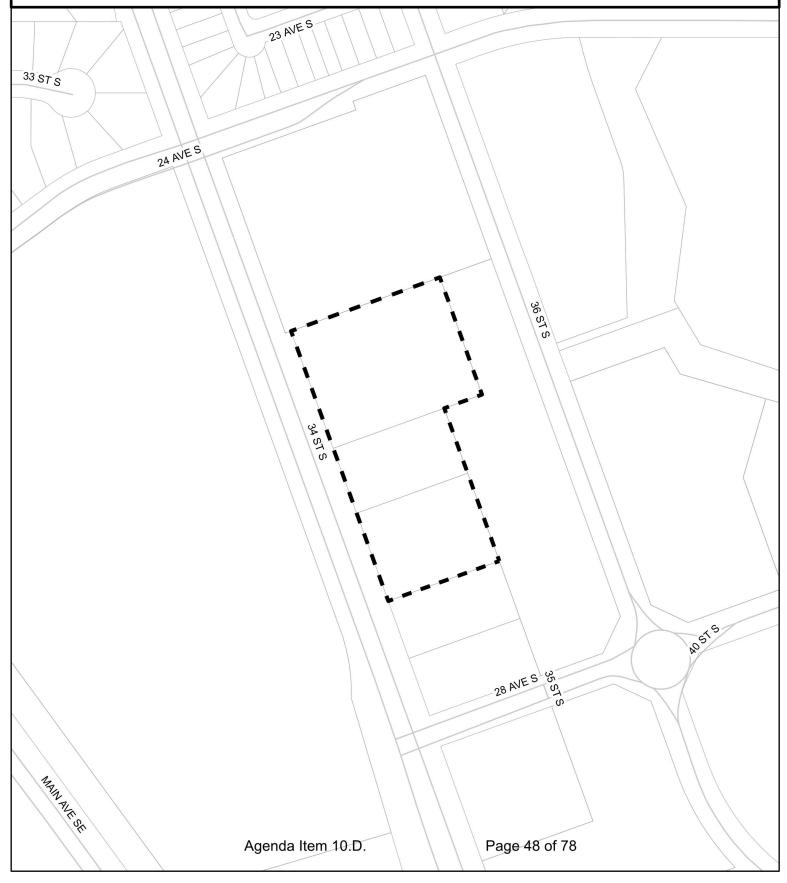




Horizon Shores Development Deferred Assessments Projects 811919 through 811925

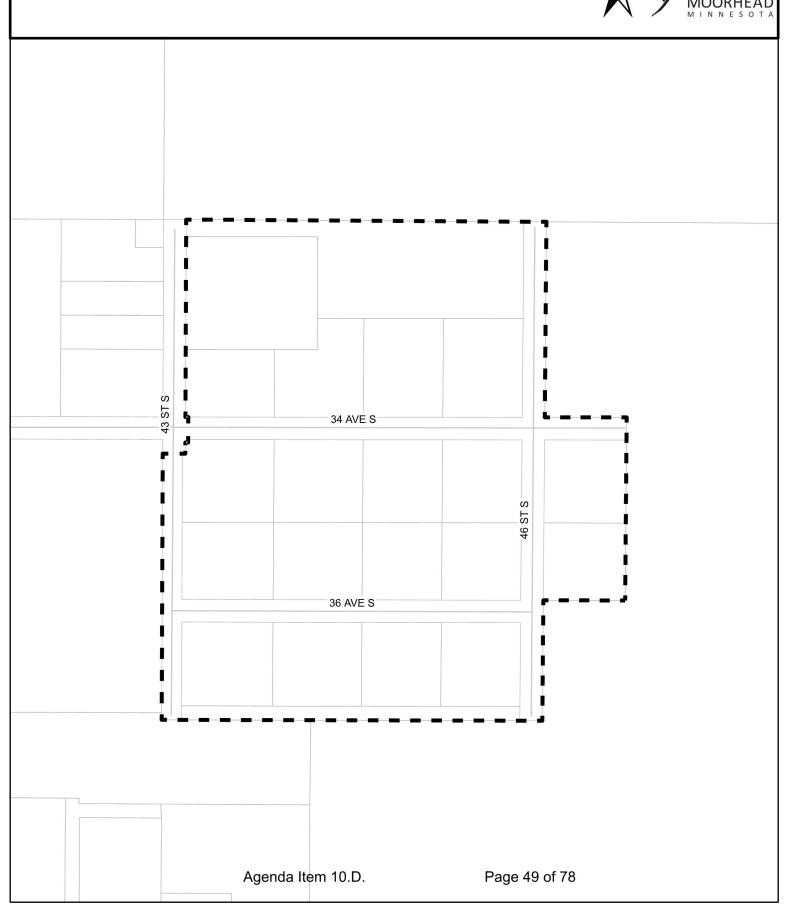




MCCARA 5th Addition Deferred Assessment Projects 811922 and 811926

Resolution to Authorize Grant Submission for Carbon Reduction Program for Street Light Replacement

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to authorize the submittal of a grant application for the Carbon Reduction Program for replacement of street lights.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) was established as part of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) passed in 2021. The purpose of the program is to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from on-road highway sources. Among several eligible activities in the CRP program, grant funds may be used to replace street lights and traffic control devices with energy-efficient alternatives. The proposed Street Light Replacement project focuses on replacement of High-Pressure Sodium light bulbs with LED light bulbs which is intended to reduce energy consumption and provide improved lighting for pedestrians, cyclists, vehicles, and transit users. Areas anticipated to be replaced include commercial lighting along Hwy 75 North, areas of 1st Ave N, SE Main Ave, 20th St S, 30th Ave S and 12th Ave S around the Horizon Middle School Area. The final locations for lights to be replaced will be based on available budget and approved by the Street Light Committee. A grant award would allow work to be completed in 2024.

Grants will be awarded through Metro COG. For 2024, \$122,000 is available for the Minnesota portion of the urban area. Staff consulted with the City of Dilworth and Clay County (other eligible applicants) to identify eligible projects. The City of Dilworth will be submitting an application. Clay County will not be submitting an application. The City's application has been formulated to allow both applications to be funded.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The proposed budget for the project includes:

Grant Request: \$76,650
 Local Match: \$19,162
 Total Cost: \$95,812

The grant program requires a 20% local match. If the grant is awarded, the project will be included in the 2024-2028 Capital Improvement Plan with local funds provided from the Street Light Utility Reserve account for this match. The City Finance Director has been consulted and supports this proposed local match source.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider a resolution to award the bid for the 2023 Sanitary Sewer Lining Improvements (Eng. No. 23-06-02) to Insituform Technologies USA, LLC. of Chesterfield, MO in the amount of \$140,519.00.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The proposed project is part of the City's asset management program covering approximately 163 miles of gravity sanitary sewer. The program includes a condition assessment (to define the probability of a failure) combined with a consequence assessment (to define the severity of a failure) to establish a risk assessment ranking for each segment of sanitary sewer. Each year, a portion of the system is inspected via televising. The televising schedule is generally informed by risk assessment rankings. Based on the inspection results, gravity sewers in need of rehabilitation are identified. Whenever possible, trenchless lining is the preferred, most common, and most cost-effective method of rehabilitation. The proposed project includes trenchless lining of six gravity sewer segments (see attached map). The asset management program is a tool that allows staff to prioritize projects and maintain the system in a fiscally responsible manner. Projects are programmed into the Wastewater Treatment budget annually.

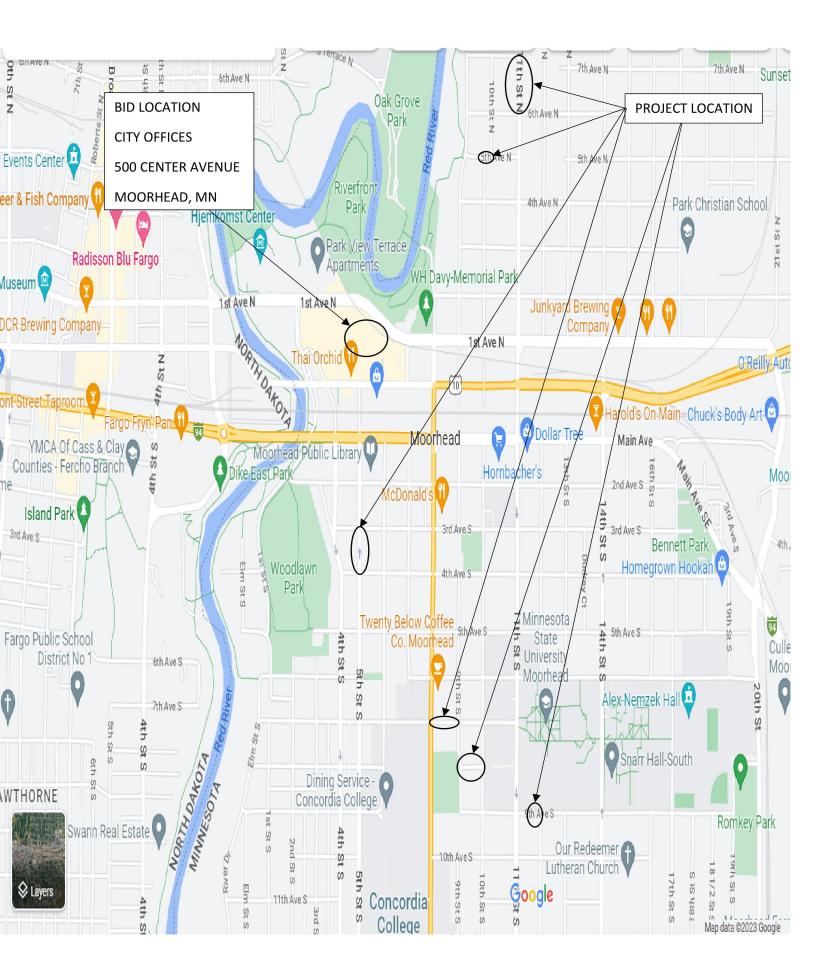

Resolution to Accept Grant Funds from Age-Friendly Minnesota (AFMN) Community Grants for Pickleball Courts

RECOMMENDATION:

Resolution to accept grant funds from Age-Friendly Minnesota to convert two tennis courts into 3-4 pickleball courts at Hansmann Park.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in America and by far the most requested amenity to the Park Department by Moorhead Citizens. This growth is mainly due to the wide age range of individuals who can participate. To meet this need, the Parks Advisory Board previously reviewed the recommendation to convert underutilized tennis courts in various neighborhood parks into pickleball courts. Depending on the size of the tennis court, two pickleball courts will fit into one tennis court.

To help fund this transition, staff submitted a grant request to Age-Friendly Minnesota (AFMN) Community Grants to convert two courts at Hansmann Park on the north end of town and one court at Riverview Estates on the Southside. Staff were notified that the City received one half of the grant requested at \$27,977 to do one of the two parks submitted. Staff are recommending Hansmann Park due to the availability of parking for what we anticipate to be a very popular amenity. The one court at Riverview Estates will be transitioned using previously approved 2023 Park Amenities funds.

Some of the terms of the grant agreement include:

- Project must be completed in the 2nd or 3rd quarter of 2023.
- Grantees are required to attend approximately 6-8 events (such as webinars, conferences, meetings, etc.) led by the Age-Friendly Minnesota (AFMN) Team. Events will include both virtual and in-person formats, including a regional conference, and will focus on peer-to-peer learning among AFMN Grantees. Staff have determined that they will split up attending these events to meet the requirement.
- Other approved amenities in the grant include 2 benches and a windscreen around the courts.

All grants accepted must be through City Council resolution as per Minnesota Statute.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The \$27,977.00 grant award from Age-Friendly Minnesota will cover the transition of two existing tennis courts into 3 – 4 pickleball courts, 2 benches and a windscreen.

Second Reading of Ordinance 2023-06: An Ordinance to Amend Title 1, Chapter 7, Planning Commission as it relates to Membership

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider a second reading of Ordinance 2023-06: An ordinance to amend Title 1, Chapter 7, Planning Commission and a Resolution to Approve Title & Summary of Ordinance 2023-06.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

Late last year, the Clay County Board of Commissioners requested that an alternate member from their board be permitted on the Planning Commission. I mentioned that the Planning Commission ordinance and bylaws do not allow for this but that I would look into it.

After discussion with the City Manager, it was recommended that we amend City of Moorhead Code of Ordinances Title 1-7-1, which establishes the Planning Commission, by adding both an alternate for the Clay County Commission and the City Council so there may be additional representation from both boards in the case of regular member absences.

The proposed language adds that the Mayor and Clay County Commission "may appoint" an alternate so that if they do not, it would not hold up meetings.

ORDINANCE 2023-06

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE 1, CHAPTER 7, PLANNING COMMISSION AS IT RELATES TO MEMBERSHIP

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOORHEAD AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Title 1, Chapter 7 of the Moorhead Municipal Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

- 1-7-1: PLANNING COMMISSION ESTABLISHED, MEMBERSHIP:
- A. Establishment: A city planning commission for the city of Moorhead is hereby established. (Ord. 283; amd. Ord. 304; 1967 Code §41.01a)
 - B. Composition, Term, Oath, Fees And Vote:
- 1. The planning commission shall consist of seven (7) appointed members. The appointed members of the commission shall all be residents of the city and shall be selected by appointment as hereinafter defined and subject to the confirmation of the council. The two (2) council members from each ward shall collectively appoint one member from the ward they represent. The mayor shall appoint one member at large. The mayor shall appoint one council member and the board of county commissioners shall appoint a member from its own membership. (Ord. 94-16, 9-19-1994, eff. 2-1-1995) The mayor and board of county commissioners may also appoint one voting alternate member each from their membership to serve in the regular appointee's absence.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon publication in accordance with the Moorhead City Charter.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The current Towing Contract with Ed's Towing Service, CO., will expire on April 30, 2023. They have been providing the tow service since May 1, 2021. Ed's Towing Service, Co., and Aggressive Towing & Recovery, were the only companies to submit bids for the 2023-2025 contract.
